Discussion Guide Part 11 August 19, 2018 A Child Is Born!



- 1. Read <u>Ruth 4:11-22</u>
- 2. Once Boaz announced his intention to marry Ruth (4: 9-0), we read that all the people and elders offered a blessing to Ruth and Boaz. (see verses 11-12). The elders and the crowd wished Boaz and Ruth a destiny of prosperity and prominence like those of the famous ancestors Jacob, Rachel, Leah, and Perez. What is the role of the public in Christian marriages? Is it important that the wedding be public and with the blessing of the Church? Why or why not?

- Ruth was childless when her first husband died. How does the narrator remind us that this child born to Boaz and Ruth was a miracle?
- 4. After the birth of Obed, the same women that heard Naomi's complaint in 1:19f, now offer a blessing. They remind Naomi of how "full" she has become. Is there an example here for us when we celebrate the birth of a child? What might a "baby shower" look like that embraced some of these principles?
- 5. Pastor Jim stated that the real message of this passage is the narrator's comment in verse 17. He said that "Obed would grandfather the greatest king in Israel's history. David would usher in "the golden age of Israel's history". In David would come the

Savior of the world who would establish an eternal kingdom. Based on what you remember about the context (the days of the judges) why is this good news?
