

# WE HAVE SEEN HIS GLORY The Glory of the Advent of Christ

Abraham was looking forward to Christmas

TEXT: John 8:48-59 (ESV)

## THE STORY



He not only claims the <u>Christocentric<sup>1</sup> worldview of Abraham</u>; He claims that He existed before Abraham, indeed <u>He claims to be eternal</u>. Of course, there is only one eternal being, that is God.

#### WHAT DAY DID ABRAHAM SEE?

Abraham's worldview<sup>2</sup>.

Hebrews 11:8-19. Notice verse 17: "his ONLY son."

Abraham's worldview was to see spiritual certainties in the physical realities. "The joy of Abraham refers to the birth of Isaac. Abraham saw in Isaac the hope of mankind and the promise of a Messiah. He saw the promise afar off (Heb 11:13)."<sup>1</sup>

#### THE MAIN POINT

Abraham found his ultimate fulfillment and joy in the person of Jesus Christ. Or stated otherwise: Abraham was dreaming of Christmas and when it came, he saw it and was glad!

Can we look past the physical, the earthy, the temporary and find our ultimate joy and happiness in Christ alone?
